

Pantheon of Greek Gods

1. Aeolus – The god of the winds
2. Amphitrite – goddess of the sea and the wife of Poseidon
3. Ananke – mother of Adrasteia, distributor of rewards and punishments, by Zeus
4. Aphrodite – The goddess of love and beauty
5. Apollo - God of healing, prophecy and the arts, especially music
6. Ares – God of War
7. Artemis – The virgin goddess of the hunt and the moon and twin sister of Apollo.
8. Asclepius – Apollo's son, the god of medicine
9. Athena – Daughter of Zeus and the goddess of wisdom, the practical arts, and warfare, and the protectress of cities, especially Athens
10. Atropos – One of the three Fates, the cutter of the thread of destiny
11. Boreas – God of the north wind
12. Charites - Graces
13. Clotho – One of the three Fates, the spinner of the thread of destiny
14. Cronus – Titan who ruled the universe until dethroned by his son Zeus
15. Demeter – The goddess of the harvest, daughter of Rhea and Cronus and mother of Persephone
16. Dionysus – The god of wine and of an orgiastic religion celebrating the power and fertility of nature; also called Bacchus
17. Eos – Goddess of the dawn
18. Erinyes – The Furies: The three terrible winged goddesses with serpentine hair, Alecto, Megaera, and Tisiphone, who pursue and punish doers of unavenged crimes
19. Eris – Goddess of Discord
20. Eros – The god of love, son of Aphrodite
21. Eurus – The god of the east or southeast wind
22. Gaia – The goddess of the earth, who bore and married Uranus and became the mother of the Titans and the Cyclopes
23. Hades – The god of the netherworld and dispenser of earthly riches
24. Hebe – The goddess of youth and spring, cupbearer to the Olympian gods
25. Hecate – An ancient fertility goddess who later became associated with Persephone as queen of Hades and protector of witches
26. Helios – The sun god, son of Hyperion, depicted as driving his chariot across the sky from east to west daily
27. Hera – The goddess of women, marriage, and childbirth; the wife and sister of Zeus
28. Heracles (Also Hercules) – The son of Zeus and Alcmene, a hero of extraordinary strength who won immortality by performing 12 labors demanded by the Argive king Eurystheus
29. Hermes – The god of commerce, invention, cunning, and theft, who also served as messenger, scribe, and herald for the other gods
30. Hesperides – Nymphs who lived at the western end of the world and guarded the golden apples that Gaia had given to the goddess Hera when Hera married Zeus

31. Hesperis – Mother of the Hesperides
32. Hestia – The goddess of the hearth, daughter of Cronus and Rhea
33. Hygeia – A daughter of Asclepius and goddess of health
34. Hypnos – God of sleep Lachesis – One of the three Fates, the measurer of the thread of destiny
35. Leto – A consort of Zeus and the mother of Apollo and Artemis
36. Moirae (Fates) – The three goddesses, Clotho, Lachesis, and Atropos, who control human destiny
37. Nike – The goddess of victory
38. Pan – The god of woods, fields, and flocks, having a human torso and head with a goat's legs, horns, and ears
39. Persephone – The daughter of Demeter and Zeus who was abducted by Hades but rescued by her mother and thereafter spent six months of the year on earth and six months in the underworld
40. Poseidon – The god of the waters, earthquakes, and horses, and brother of Zeus
41. Satyr – A woodland creature depicted as having the pointed ears, legs, and short horns of a goat and a fondness for unrestrained revelry
42. Selene – The goddess of the moon
43. Semele – The mother of Dionysus by Zeus
44. Silenus – Any of the minor woodland deities and companions of Dionysus, depicted on Greek vases as men with the tails, ears, and hooves of horses
45. Themis – Mother of the three fates by Zeus
46. Tyche – Goddess of chance
47. Zephyrus – A god personifying the gentle west wind
48. Zeus – The principal god of the Greek pantheon, ruler of the heavens, and father of other gods and mortal heroes
